#### Other News...

#### **Community Speed Watch folds**

Village volunteers had given up their time regularly for a couple of years to help monitor speeding traffic through Froxfield and do their bit to try to to stop drivers flouting the law. But it has taken its toll. Now organiser Sarah Whatley says they have had to admit defeat.

No new team members have come forward and others were no longer prepared to take the abusive language and rude hand gestures which some drivers fling at them. There were five regulars and several more occasional volunteers. Said Sarah: "We have been struggling for new volunteers for a long time. We all felt uncomfortable with the rude gestures and frequent rude verbal remarks being shouted at us. But, in the end, it was the failure to attract more volunteers which led us to hand back the equipment to the police — who said they weren't surprised as other groups were experiencing the same problems! It's such a shame as it was so difficult and protracted getting the CSW set up in the first place!"

• The village is now waiting for an official Traffic Speed Survey by Wiltshire Council. If this shows the same levels of speeding so regularly recorded by Sarah and the Community Speed Watch team, we may be able to pressure for more action by the police. We are also waiting for a formal speed limit assessment by the council, with the aim of reducing the 50mph speed limit down to 40mph but, as yet, there is no date set for this.

## **Swings update**

The Parish Council has applied for a grant from the National Lottery fund — but as yet, we await a decision. However, while we wait, prices are going up as well! We will continue to raise money for the



playground equipment from sales of refreshments at the Kings Coronation Picnic and would **gratefully accept donations from local businesses** towards the swings — anyone making a sizeable donation will have their name recorded on a commemorative plaque!

#### On-demand bus service - next month

The new on-demand bus service is imminent, with a anticipated launch date in May!

The current 20/22/X22 bus service will run in parallel until July/August, so there will be a period where people can try the new service whilst the existing services are still running.

Three on-demand pickup points have been confirmed: The existing bus stop on Church Lane, the carpark of The Pelican and the bottom of Brewhouse Hill (where the primary school mini bus currently picks up). As soon as we have confirmation of the details we will let you know.
